

## IT'S FAIR TO BE SAFE!

#### **Prevent Theft.**

In order to deter theft, we urge all patrons to make sure that no purses or bags are left inside a parked vehicle. Patrons should also ensure that their vehicle doors are locked, and valuables are secured in the trunk before entering the Fairgrounds. We also suggest that patrons take the extra time necessary to arrive early and park in the Main Lot nearest the Rodeo Arena. This parking lot will be patrolled by security and is well lit.

#### Watch the Time.

Officers will again be enforcing the city curfew ordinance during the Fair. The curfew applies to children under the age of 18. The city curfew begins at 11pm Sunday through Thursday and midnight on Friday and Saturday nights. This means that after the curfew hour children under the age of 18 must be in the immediate company of a parent or guardian while on the Fairgrounds property. Any juvenile that is not in the company of an adult after the set curfew hours is subject to be ticketed for curfew violation.

#### No weapons Allowed.

No weapons are allowed, and violators will be arrested. This includes, but is not limited to, pocket knives, mace, or self defense weapons. Please leave them at home or in your car.

Pursuant to Fair Association Rules, all persons entering the Fairgrounds property are subject to be scanned by metal detectors. In addition to this, all bags are subject to be searched by Fairgrounds security, for weapons and contraband. No large bags and purses are permitted into the arena or Fairgrounds. Consolidate belongings into a small clutch or crossbody.

- Youth 15 years of age and younger must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- No sagging pants are allowed inside the Fairgrounds. Persons with sagging pants will not be allowed inside or will be escorted off the premises.
- All attendees are asked to dress accordingly. This is a family friendly event.
- No large groups of unsupervised teens will be allowed to run rampant or widespread. These groups, when unsupervised, tend to develop unruly behavior and cause panic among other fair goers.
- If children of any age are left unattended, parents should ensure that the child has emergency instructions and parent contact information available. Make sure that an adult can always be reached while children are attending the Fair.

Just a reminder, when an individual is banned from the Fairgrounds the ban remains on that person indefinitely. If that individual is later located on Fairgrounds property, they will be issued a citation or arrested for criminal trespassing. People who have been previously banned from the Fairgrounds and would like to receive consideration to have the ban removed may contact the Fair office at 903-773-2941.

These measures have been put in place to provide the safest environment possible for visitors to the Fair. The Texarkana Arkansas Police

Department hopes that everyone will have a safe time while at the Fair. Our officers will be on foot inside the Fairgrounds, so feel free to approach them with any questions or concerns.






All entries to the home arts and fine arts departments at the four states fair must be made online by March 22nd at 5:00 p.m.

All entries will be picked up the Monday following the fair from 3:00 pm - 6:00 pm. on April 15th.





he socio-economic landscape of any community is shaped by a diverse array of entities, each playing a unique role in fostering growth and well-being. These entities are governed by a board of directors or trustees. They have no private ownership, and decisions are made with organization's mission and community's best interests in mind.

Non-profits are exempt from certain taxes due to their focus on public benefit. Contributions non-profits may also tax deductible for donors.

#### How do they help our communities?

#### **FOR-PROFIT COMPANIES:**

While contributing to the economy creation, for-profit job companies may also engage in corporate social responsibility (CSR) initiatives to positively impact the community.

They drive economic growth by creating jobs, fostering innovation, and contributing to a robust business environment.

#### NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS:

These entities directly address social issues, provide essential services, and champion causes that may be underserved by the private sector.

They play a crucial role in addressing societal challenges, promoting equality, and enhancing the overall well-being of the community.

The coexistence for-profit non-profit companies and organizations is essential for a thriving community. While for-profits contribute to economic growth, non-profits address social issues and advocate for positive change. Embracing the unique strengths of each sector and promoting collaboration between them can create a well-rounded foundation for community prosperity.



#### **Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA)**
