their parent, the right to handle their financial affairs in the event they become incapacitated.

### **Medical Power of** Attorney

Still paying for health insurance for your now adult child? Oh well! It doesn't mean you can automatically make medical decisions for them if they are incapacitated. Without a medical power of attorney in place, parents may be faced with the time consuming and costly process of seeking a guardianship in court. However, by signing a medical power of attorney, the child can designate their parent (or whoever they choose) to make medical decisions on their behalf.

#### **HIPAA Waiver**

When your child turns eighteen, the privacy of their personal health information is also protected under the Health Information Portability and Accountability Act, known as HIPAA. Health care providers are not legally permitted to disclose or discuss a person's medical records, status, or treatment with anyoneeven a parent who pays for the health insurance plan they are onwithout the person's consent.

A HIPAA waiver allows the now adult child to designate who doctors can talk to about their health status. condition, and treatment.

# Directive to Physicians or Living Will

A living will (also known as a directive to physicians or advance directive) allows a person to specify personal choices they want to have made about life-extending treatments in the event they cannot communicate their wishes. Of course, no one likes to think about having to make these hard decisions, but bad things happen and it is important to plan ahead.

#### **FERPA Waiver**

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is in place to protect the privacy of a person's educational records. These can include report cards, test results, and disciplinary records. When a child is a minor, a parent can easily obtain these records. However, once a child turns eighteen, like so many other things, circumstances change. When the child turns eighteen or enters college, their academic records are theirs even if you are footing the tuition bill. A FERPA waiver allows the student to designate who can obtain their educational records.

It is important to remember that each state has its own specific requirements for each of these documents. No matter where your child lives or is going to school, each of these documents is important, but they may be different. Therefore, it is important to speak to an estate planning attorney who is familiar with these documents and can make sure these documents are tailored to meet all necessary legal requirements.

Your child will always be your baby boy or baby girl, but when they become your adult baby boy or baby girl these important legal issues need to be discussed. This is also an excellent opportunity to have some "adult" conversations of about the seriousness of certain decisions, provide guidance about important upcoming life decisions, and discuss expectations while they are technically (although not necessarily legally) under your guidance and influence.
