Stage 1-Rear-facing seat

All infants and toddlers should ride in a rear-facing car seat until they are 2 years old, or until they reach the highest weight or height allowed by their car seat's manufacturer.




Stage 2- Convertible or forward-facing seat

Any child 2 or older who has outgrown the rear-facing weight or height limit for a car seat should use a forward-facing car seat with a harness for as long as possible, up to the highest weight or height allowed by their car seat's manufacturer. This also applies to any child younger than 2 years who has outgrown the rear-facing weight or height limit of their seat.



Stage 3- Forward-facing or booster seat

Children whose weight or height exceeds the limit for a forward-facing car seat should switch to a belt-positioning booster seat. These children should remain in a booster seat until the vehicle seat belt fits properly, typically when they reach 4 feet 9 inches in height and are between 8 and 12 years of age.



Stage 4- Seat belts

When children are old enough and large enough to use the vehicle seat belt alone, they should always use lap and shoulder seat belts for optimal protection. Lap portion should be low over the hips/tops of the thighs (not over the stomach) and shoulder belt should cross the center of the shoulder and center of the chest (not the neck). Children younger than 13 years old are safest in the back seat.

Peace of Mind While Parents are Away

As families gear up for vacations, summer camps, and visits to grandparents, it's important to think beyond the packing list. While you're away, who would make decisions if your child needs medical care or school enrollment paperwork signed?

A Texas Minor Power of Attorney (POA) offers a simple and effective way to authorize a trusted adult to step in when needed—without giving up your parental rights.

What Is a Texas Minor Power of Attorney?

A Texas Minor Power of Attorney allows a parent or guardian to temporarily authorize another adult to make decisions about a child's education, healthcare, and daily needs. This authorization is temporary and does not terminate or affect your underlying parental rights.

It simply provides a trusted adult with legal authority to act when you are unavailable—whether you're traveling, deployed for military service, undergoing medical treatment, or facing a situation where help is needed.

When Should You Use a Texas Minor POA?

Parents often create a Minor Power of Attorney when:

- > Traveling for an extended period
- > Deployed for military service
- > Undergoing medical treatment or recovery
- > Needing a grandparent, relative, or trusted family friend to care for their child temporarily

Having the right documents in place can prevent confusion, delays, or even unnecessary court involvement during your absence.

What a Texas Minor POA Can and Cannot Do

A Texas Minor Power of Attorney is powerful but limited. Here's a straightforward guide to what it allows—and what it does not:

What It Can Do:

- > Authorize medical decisions, including emergency treatment
- > Provide temporary caregiving authority without court proceedings
- > Manage school enrollment and education-related matters

What It Cannot Do:

- > Terminate or modify parental rights
- > Override court-ordered custody arrangements
- > Establish a permanent guardianship

This document gives caregivers flexibility to handle day-to-day responsibilities, but it respects and protects the parent's ultimate authority.

Limiting the Scope to Fit Your Needs

Parents do not have to provide authorization for each and every permissible item provided by statute. Parents can tailor a Minor POA to grant only the powers they choose and that are needed for their specific circumstance. For example, there may not be (and likely will not be) a need to grant another person the authority to enroll the child in school. But, you might authorize the caregiver to make medical decisions in your absence. You may also limit the authority to a specific time period, such as the two weeks you'll be traveling.

Carefully defining the scope of authority ensures the document fits your specific situation and gives you peace of mind.

Who Can Be Authorized?

Any trusted adult caregiver can be authorized through a Minor Power of Attorney. Parents often name grandparents, adult siblings, aunts or uncles, or close family friends—anyone they trust to act responsibly in their place. Choosing the right caregiver and clearly outlining their authority helps ensure your child is well cared for and that decisions are made just as you would want.

Preparing for Summer—and Beyond

As you prepare for your summer plans, taking a few minutes to complete a Minor Power of Attorney is one of the most simple and most important steps you can take to protect your child. It avoids last-minute scrambles, ensures prompt medical care if needed, and gives everyone involved clarity and confidence.




